Zainisha

22 year-old Zainisha was devastated when an obstructed labor left her with obstetric fistula. Her baby was stillborn, her friends were distant, and she had never met anyone with her condition—leaking urine uncontrollably. Local doctors didn't know how to help her. But everything changed when she was referred to Fistula Foundation's partner hospital. In the fistula ward, Zainisha met other women with her condition and began to feel hope. 50,000 Surgeries, 50,000 Stories

In 2020, we hit a remarkable milestone: 50,000 fistula repair surgeries since 2009. Your generosity made this possible.

Women with fistula face immense challenges. Usually, their baby has died. Too often, they are stigmatized and ostracized because of their incontinence. Behind each surgery is a story like Zainisha's—despair turned to hope and healing, thanks to supporters like you.





Fistula is most prevalent in sub-Saharan Africa and Asia, so that's where we focus our efforts. We approach our work with humility. We know that local doctors understand how to treat fistula far better than we ever will.



"Sometimes the people who come don't want to show [their private areas] to male surgeons. The females want female surgeons. So, I think for Bangladeshi people, there is a need for female fistula surgeons. But in Cox's Bazar, I am the only one."

Dr. Fahmida Akter

Dr. Fahmida Akter was certified as a fistula surgeon in 2018. Since then, she has continued to provide fistula surgeries in Bangladesh amidst the overlapping Rohingya refugee crisis and Covid-19 pandemic.

Our longtime partner, Dr. Denis Mukwege, is a legendary activist, fistula surgeon, and founder of Panzi Hospital in the Democratic Republic of Congo. In 2018, he received the Nobel Peace Prize for his work with women who are survivors of wartime rape.
